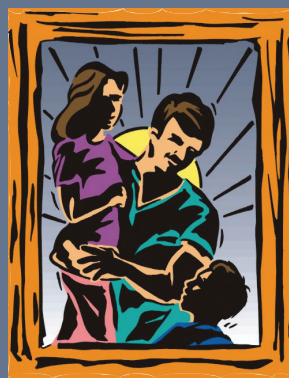
At least once a year we organize Work Groups of kindhearted Americans who travel with us to Mexico's Baja Peninsula and
